Jane & Jack Gill celebrated their 65th Wedding Anniversary at Northern Colorado Medical Center on Thursday, August 26th with the help of Jack's nurse in providing a cake to celebrate their special occasion. By Trevor Reid, Greeley Tribune: shared in Reporter Herald on Sunday, August 29, 2021

Efforts to slow the spread of COVID-19 has led to feelings of isolation for many over the past 18 months, especially in cases where hospitalized patients weathered their stays apart from loved



ones. For some, this even meant saying final goodbyes over cellphone screens. But COVID-19 vaccines have changed the script in many ways, as one couple in their 80s showed celebrating their 65th anniversary Thursday at North Colorado Medical Center. Earlier this month, 86-year-old Jane Gill started coughing, developed a low-grade fever and a "horrible fatigue." She went into the emergency room, where they determined she had COVID-19. Jane, a former registered nurse herself, had received both doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. Her husband, 87-year-old Jack Gill, was admitted two days later, after a fall. He also tested positive for COVID-19, also having received both COVID-19 shots. Though breakthrough infections do occur among the vaccinated, medical professionals say the vaccine still reduces the risk of serious illness and death. "We've been told by more than one medical source here that that's probably what's kept us off ventilators and kept us less severely ill and probably will shorten the duration of our illness," Jane said. Jack said his stay at the hospital has been "very, very positive," adding his appreciation for the hospital and its staff in recent years due to other medical issues. Jack credited Dr. Moe Lyons, Dr. Gene Tullis and Dr. Katherine Schuetze — who he said have saved his life on more than one occasion. "These people walk on water," he said. "I could not praise this hospital and their staff enough. They have done so much for our family." Bre Olson, a registered nurse at the hospital since October, was assigned to care for Jack this week. His cheerful attitude and singing were a bright spot in what's been difficult work as hospitalizations have increased significantly over the past two weeks. As they got to talking, Olson learned Jack's wife was also in the hospital and that their wedding anniversary was the next day. She felt bad for the couple and set out to mark the occasion. Olson told Gill she'd have a surprise for him the next day, to share with his wife. Olson worked with nurse Julie Peters, who was caring for Jane across the hall, to set up the celebration. Olson picked up flowers, a card and chocolates. Peters suggested getting a cake from culinary staff, who baked a cake in a "65" shape. The couple had been separated in their stays up until the special visit, so it was an emotional moment for all. "When I took him over to her room that morning, she started crying because he had flowers in his hand," Olson said. "They're just the sweetest couple ever. They have the cutest stories for 65 years. They are literally more in love than they've ever been, and it's the cutest thing ever." Ever the singer, Jack sang his and Jane's song, "The Twelfth of Never," for the occasion. Nurse Rhonda Turner also witnessed the moment. "As soon as they made eye contact, they just lit up — didn't need any kind of light on them, they were just glowing," Turner said. "We always put our love for each other first," Jack said. "Makes things work.




