A GOD-WINK OPPORTUNITY

On August 23, Loveland Preschool (LPS), a cherished place for early childhood education in Loveland for 60 years, received notice that their lease would not be renewed as of the 2025/2026 school year. They immediately began looking for a new long-term home, as they had only about two months to locate a new place and notify the State by November 1, or they would go out of business. After many conversations between FUMC and LPS, and many hours of research, on October 7 Church Council voted in favor of approving the preliminary architectural plans and taking the next steps toward a lease with LPS and welcoming them to their new home at FUMC. On **Thursday, October 17**, the FUMC Charge Conference, the governing body in any local UMC church, (made up of Church Council members and retired clergy who hold membership in the church) will meet to take the next step in the process by voting on approval of the intent to lease space to LPS, approve the preliminary architectural plans, begin gathering renovation bids and developing the lease agreement. This charge conference will be an open meeting. Anyone who is interested in knowing more about this marvelous opportunity is welcome to attend as a non-voting guest. **The meeting will begin at 5:30pm in the Sanctuary.**
